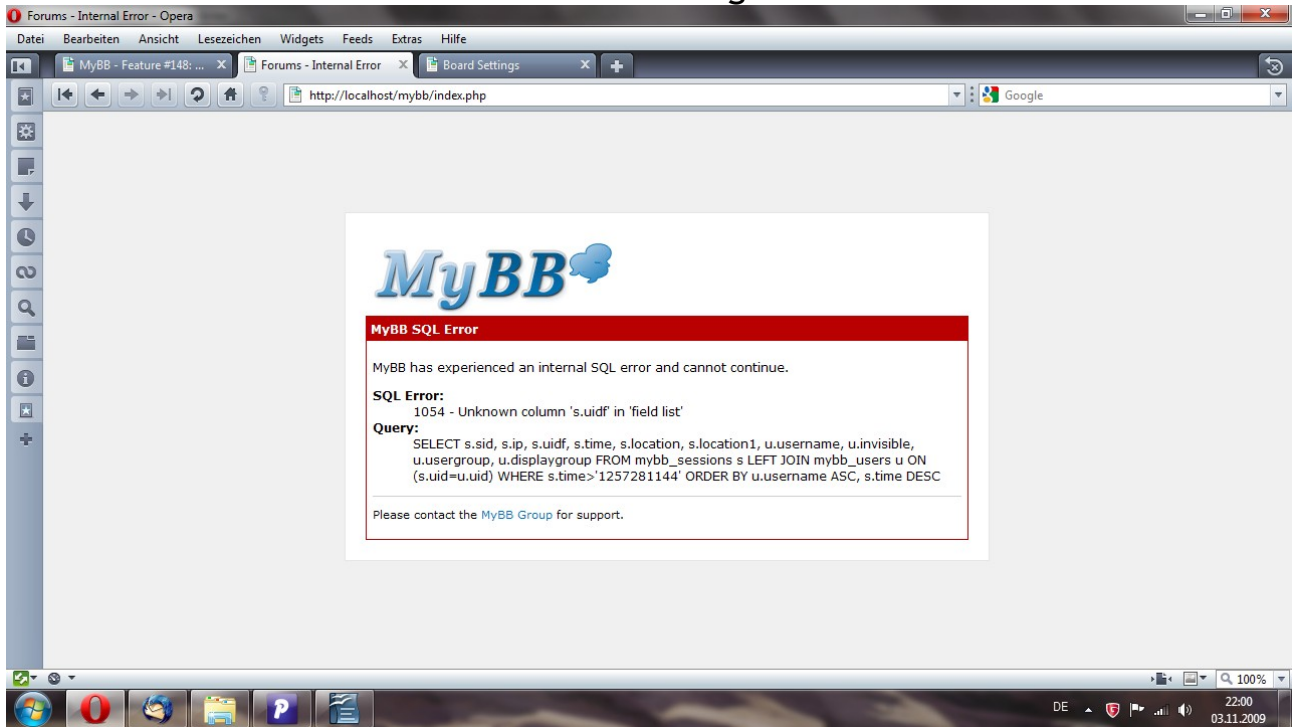
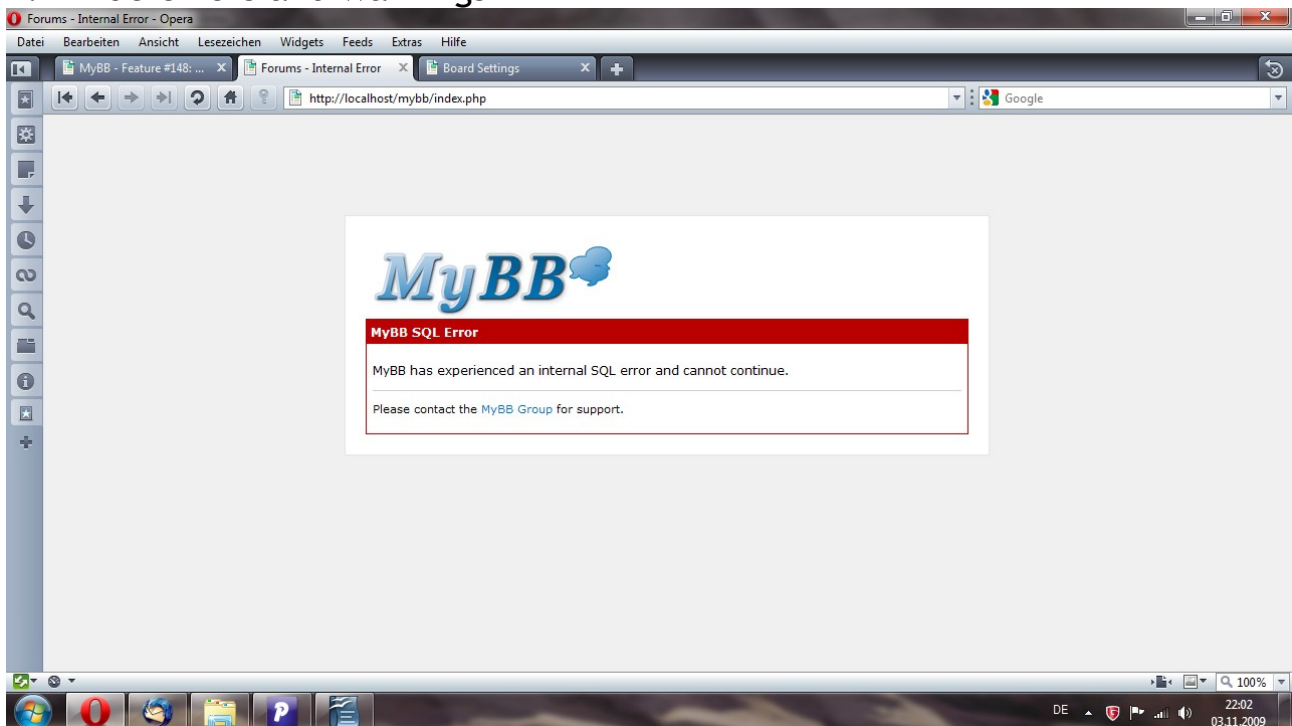


# 1. An error appears

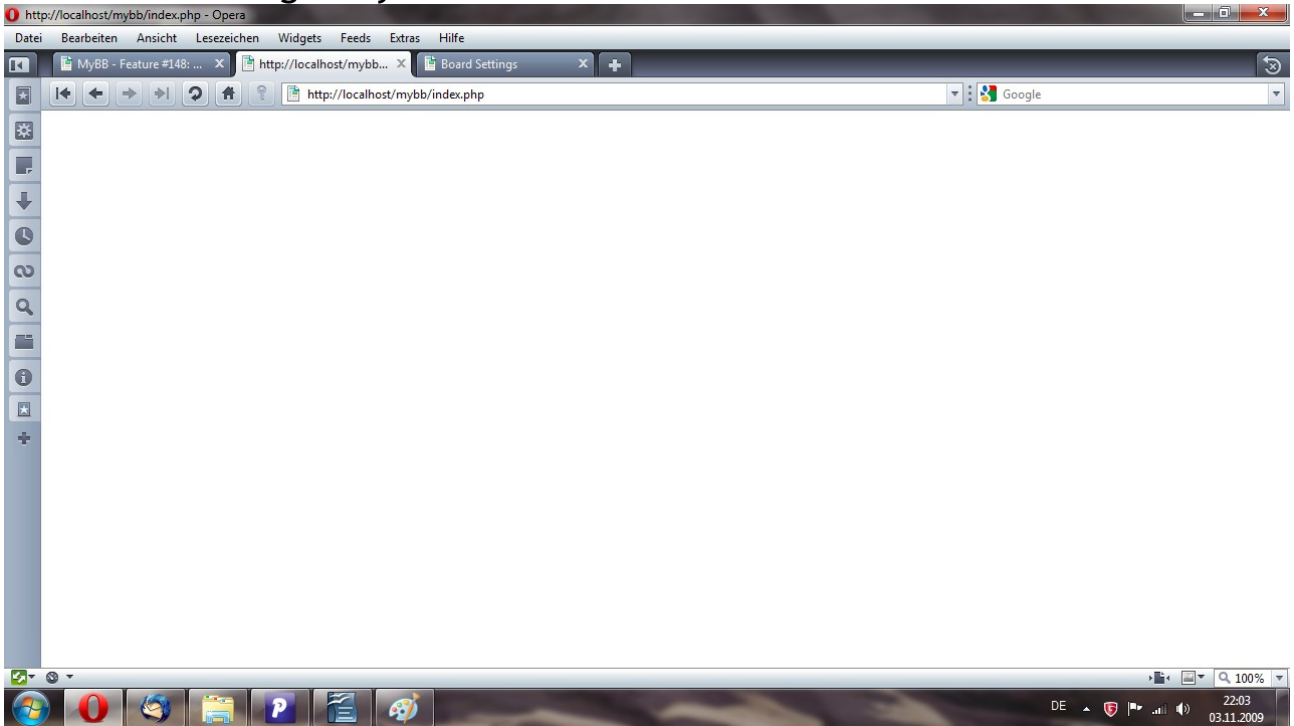
## 1.1 Show errors OR show errors and warnings

## 1.3 Show warnings only



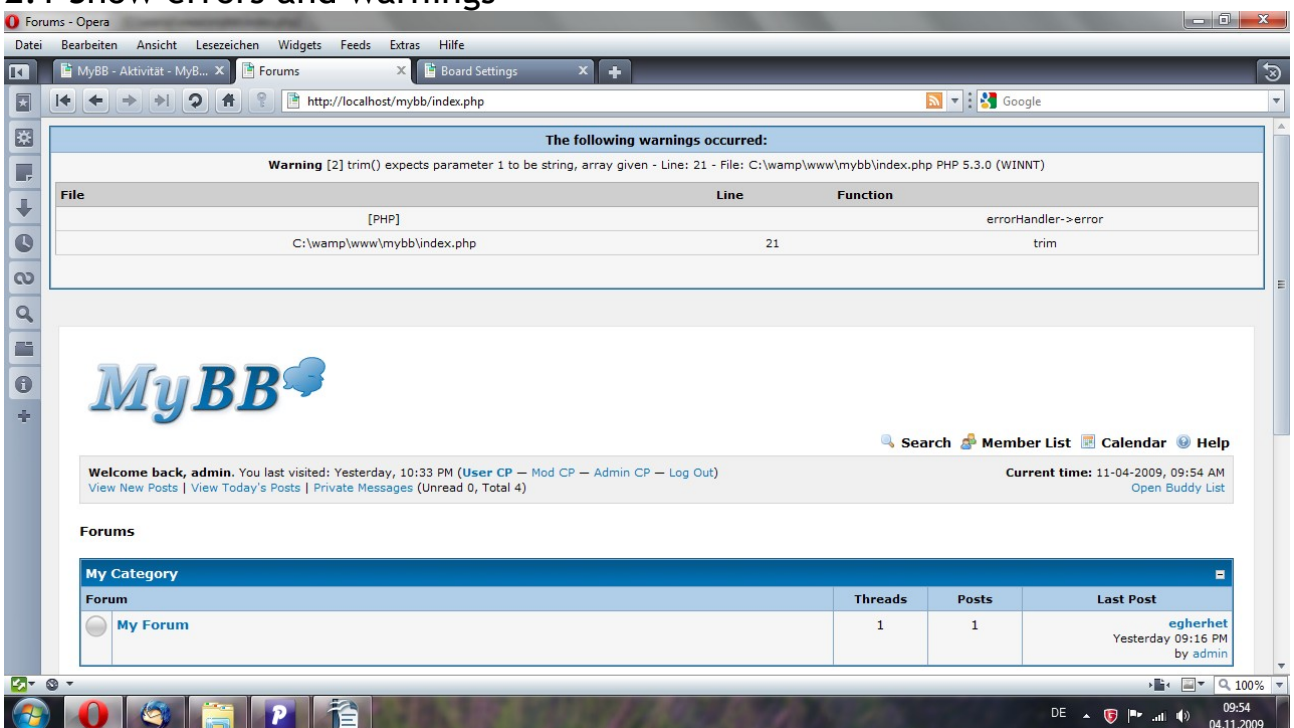
## Conclusion

In the cases 1.2 and 1.3 errors should not be shown. But the behaviour is different:

- Hide errors and warnings: You get a message
- Show warnings only: You get a blank page



## Conclusion

In case 2.2 you get nothing although warnings should be shown.

In the cases 2.3 and 2.4 warnings should not be shown. But the behaviour is different:

- Hide errors and warnings: You get a message
- Show errors only: You see nothing
